I am very excited to be collaborating on this project alongside Queensland composer Connor D'Netto, Director Patrick Nolan and soprano Ali McGregor. I am looking forward to bringing my experience writing opera, musical theatre and popular song to this unique work.

My experience writing the opera 'Rabbits' (commissioned by Opera Australia in 2015) and my adaptation of 'Muriel's Wedding' in 2017 has given me a unique perspective on creating work for the theatrical stage that crosses genres and platforms.

To be able to create something that can be presented outside the bounds of social distancing is also essential in our current situation.

The story being told in The Phone Call is one that speaks strongly to me as a woman and as a mother. It discusses heavy themes with grace and hopefulness and thematically is an important discussion to be exploring on the theatrical stage.
